How often is training required?

Part 172, Subpart H of DOT's Title 49 CFR requires initial training within **90 days** of employment or change in job function and every **3 years** thereafter.

Why attend?

Failure to meet the DOT training requirements in 49 CFR, Part 172, Subpart H, may result in civil and/or criminal penalties.
